OUTREACH UPDATE

Celebrating Our Fifth Anniversary

The Symphony Village Outreach Program, Inc. (SVOPI) celebrates its fifth anniversary this month. My, how time flies when you are having fun and also doing so much good for the community. This organization



was initiated by the 1996 Symphony Village HOA Board, which also established the Publications & Communications and Lifestyle Committees. At that time, the HOA Board was under the direction of Caruso Homes. A non-profit 501(c)3 organization was established so that all donations would be tax exempt. The mission of SVOPI is to care for and support our fellow neighbors in Symphony Village and to provide volunteer services and financial support to non-profit organizations, civic organizations, and government agencies serving the residents of Queen Anne's County. Under the umbrella of SVOPI, the Neighbor to Neighbor Committee was formed to support our neighbors in Symphony Village, and the Caregivers Support Group was formed to support neighbors who were caring for family members.

SVOPI immediately launched into its first fundraiser, a Symphony Village House Tour. It was a huge success, led by Jeanne Novack. A second and third house tour followed every other year. The first edition of the Symphony Village Cook Book was printed in November 2007 for the benefit of Hospice of Queen Anne's. A total donation of \$50,000 was made to sponsor the kitchen of the new Hospice building with the assistance of Caruso Homes and a private donor. An elegant evening Art Auction and a Spring Flower Mart were also successful fundraisers. Recently, Winter Card Parties and a Fall Art Extravaganza have added much fun to the Symphony Village Calendar, while aiding our beneficiaries. In addition to Hospice, other donations have been made to the Adult Day Care Center, Our Haven Shelter, QAC–EMS Training, QAC Art Council, QAC Historical Society, Wounded Soldiers Weekend, Corsica River Conservancy, and the Department of Social Services Pantry. Memorial gifts from SV residents have funded charities all over the country.

We are rightfully proud of all the accomplishments of the Outreach Program during the past five years and truly grateful to all our leaders, volunteers, and supporters who give so generously of their time, talent, and gifts. We have undoubtedly demonstrated to the Town of Centreville and Queen Anne's County that the residents of Symphony Village have contributed and will continue to contribute to the betterment of our community.

Now is the time to clean and fix up your bike for the 2011 cycling season. You are invited to join your neighbors each Saturday morning to cycle on some of the scenic areas of the Eastern Shore. Get your hummingbird feeders ready – the ruby-throated hummingbirds will return to our area in mid to late April. If you want to make your own nectar, heat 1 part white sugar to 4 parts water (e.g., ¹/₄ cup sugar and 1 cup water) until the

sugar completely dissolves. Let the nectar cool before filling your feeder.

THE GAZEBO GARDEN CLUB

Good News! The purple martins have returned! The advance scouts arrived on April 4, along with our first 80 degree day. (Last year they arrived on April 3.) The large flocks have not arrived as of April 8. The reason for this is the cool weather, which keeps the flying



insects (the primary food for martins) from breeding. We expect to have the killdeer nesting in the gazebo garden for a fifth straight year.

The daffodils are in full bloom, but we have not had much luck with tulips due to the poor drainage in the gazebo garden. American flags have been purchased and will be installed before Easter. All gardeners

are requested to spruce up their assigned beds in time for Easter. Three more volunteers are needed so that all of the 20 beds in the gazebo garden have a caretaker. Please call Joan or Jack Hennessey at 410-758-4872 to volunteer. Jack will be tending the pavilion flower bed for one more year.

THE READING FOR FUN BOOK CLUB

Anchee Min. This is an historical novel based on the life of the last Empress of China. It discusses in great detail the layout and construction of The Forbidden City, which still exists today. It also gives a vivid description of the lives of the concubines of the Emperor, as well as the lives of the many eunuchs in the royal service. This book was recommended by JoAnn Milczakowski, who also provided a wonderful lemon delight cake for dessert. On a scale of 1 to 10, Empress received a

rating of 7.2. A copy of this book has been placed in the Book Club section of Symphony Village Library for resident access.

Dorthea Turek has recommended *Pearl of China*, another book by Anchee Min, for our April 19 meeting. This historical novel revolves around the life of Pearl Buck as seen through the eyes of her lifelong Chinese friend, Willow Yee. In real life, Pearl Buck is the author of *The Good Earth*, a Pulitzer Prize winning book.

HELPFUL HINTS

<u>Computer Tip--Internet Explorer "Favorites"</u> by Juana Ridgway



Using the "Favorites" option in Internet Explorer allows one to "bookmark" (create a shortcut) to the "website" for future viewing. This alleviates the need to remember and type in the website address every time one wishes to visit the website.

- 1. Start "Internet Explorer".
- 2. Go to the website you wish to add to your "Favorites" list.
- 3. Once the website is displayed, find the "Favorites" icon on the toolbar at the top of the page.
- 4. Click on the "Favorites" icon and select "Add to Favorites..."
- 5. A dialog box will appear. Click on the "Add" button and the website will be added to your "Favorites" list. Note: if you wish to change the name of the "Favorite" you are adding to your list for easier identification later, you may type in a new name in the "Name:" area before clicking on the "Add" button in the dialog box.
- 6. Once a "Favorite" has been created, it can now be accessed by clicking on the "Favorites" icon on the toolbar at the top of the page, selecting the "website" from the dropdown list, and clicking on it.
 - Multiple "Favorites" can be added to your "Favorites" list.
 - If you attempt to add the same website to your "Favorites" list twice, a dialog box will appear notifying you that the shortcut already exists.
 - Any website added to your "Favorites" will remain there until it is deleted manually. Exiting Internet Explorer or shutting down your computer will not affect your "Favorites."
 - To delete a website from your "Favorites" list, click on the "Favorites" icon on the toolbar at the top of the page, select the "website" from the dropdown list, right click on it by using your right mouse button, then select "Delete" from the dropdown menu. When the "Delete" dialog box appears, click on the "Yes" button.

• Over time, as your list of "Favorites" increases, you might find that they are no longer in alphabetical order. To correct this, simply right click on the list and select "Sort by Name."

Exhibit: Queen Anne's County and Centreville in the Civil War



Beginning on **April 30** and running through October, a fascinating exhibit featuring Queen Anne's County's, and more specifically, Centreville's involvement in the Civil War will be on display at the Chesapeake Exploration Center at Kent Narrows in Chester. The exhibit "will present many of these stories of families dealing with the problems caused by the war, as well as the war itself. In addition, a timeline of

major events leading to the war as well as battles during the war will be presented. Much of the information presented in this exhibit will be entirely new material, new family stories, and new information." Maryland Big Tree Program

Last fall, the Queen Anne's County Historical Society nominated one of the trees in the



backyard of Wright's Chance to be included in Maryland's Big Tree Program. An arborist was sent out to measure the circumference of the trunk, the height, and the width of the canopy. It is now on the Big Tree List as the 14th largest of 23 listed black walnut trees (left) in the state of Maryland.

The arborist looked at other trees in the yard and found a wild black cherry tree (right), which was also placed on the List as the 7th largest of 16 listed in Maryland. The Historical Society is very pleased to have



these trees on their property and invites you to see them on your next visit to Wright's Chance. – Ellen Norman

RESTAURANT REVIEW

Sugar Magnolia Café

If you want to indulge in a warm and serene atmosphere that is in town and full of fresh food choices, why not experience Sugar Magnolia Café? Here, the wide variety of breakfasts and lunches are *always* delicious and the desserts, coffees, and teas are heavenly.

Local owner *Marianne Jackson* has been in the restaurant /hospitality business most of her life and this really shows, as she knows most of her customers by name, their families, their businesses, and of course, how they like their coffee! Crediting her mother with teaching her how to cook and growing up on a farm, Marianne is most comfortable when she's cooking. She explains that "*there were times when we had three generations cooking in the same kitchen to feed family, friends, and workers.*" Sugar Magnolia caters to a local and transient clientele and whenever possible uses fresh, locally obtained ingredients in their made-to-order soups, salads, and sandwiches.

Stop in and order a delicious panini sandwich grilled on ciabatta bread or maybe their oldfashioned chicken salad "*made from a recipe that's been used by her family for generations*." You can select coleslaw (that is mayo free and more like a sweet pickled cabbage) or kettle chips. When you need some soup for comfort, try the homemade Tomato Basil, but don't ask for the recipes because she doesn't always know them, "...I add a little of this and that to a basic recipe until it tastes just right," she says. Don't forget to try the fresh-baked cookies, brownies, and pastries because they are delicious!



If you're looking for a full and diverse coffee bar, Sugar Magnolia offers the largest local selection, featuring *Green Mountain Coffees* from Vermont. Whether you choose an espresso, cappuccino, or latte, you won't be disappointed and don't forget to sample a gourmet hot chocolate or blended local tea from *Summerbridge Teas*.

ZUCCHINI PIE From the Kitchen of Judy Brown

3 cups zucchini, chopped 1 onion, chopped 1 cup Bisquick 4 large eggs ½ cup oil



¹/₂ cup Parmesan cheese
¹/₄ tsp. garlic powder
1 tsp. basil leaves
¹/₄ tsp. salt
¹/₄ tsp. pepper

Mix all ingredients together until well coated. Put into a buttered pie plate (10 inches or 12 inches) or an oblong 10x6x1-3/4 inch dish. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes or until golden brown. Enjoy!






