## GAZEBD and VIC'MRY GARDENS

The Gazebo Garden activity during June consisted primarily of weeding and deadheading. New flowers were added by some gardeners. Unfortunately, two items have been borrowed and never returned: a 75 -foot garden hose and a rotary sprinkler. The management has graciously replaced both items. Several families have used the Gazebo for family lunches, while observing the flying antics of the purple martins. Unfortunately, the martin house near the north pond was blown down in the recent storm. Several residents restored the house, and some of the birds have returned. A pair of killdeer has been nesting in the garden. They laid four eggs near the sliding board, three of which have hatched. Apparently, the fourth egg was not fertile and was finally abandoned by the mother. Many residents had a chance to observe the chicks running around only one day after they hatched!


The Victory Garden is now in full swing. There are 78 tomato plants, which are now yielding many tomatoes and are being shared with residents. Lots of onions, zucchini, squash, cabbage, cantaloupes, pumpkins, and even watermelon are expected in the next few months. Be nice to
 the gardeners and you may share in their harvest! Our thanks to Diane Briggs, who is allowing us to use her water during the recent dry spell.
The Victory Gardeners enjoyed a dinner at the Four Seasons Bistro recently, and they plan to hold a harvest dinner at the end of the season using their home-grown crops at a place to be determined.

## $18^{T H}$ ANNUAL CAMIP NEW DAWN VDLUNTEER "『BUDIDIES" NEEDED

Hospice of Queen Anne's Camp New Dawn will be held at Camp Pecometh on August 14-16 for children and teens who are grieving. The goal of this bereavement camp is to give area children an enjoyable, accepting, and supportive environment in which they can freely express their feelings about the loss of a loved one. Under the guidance of professional bereavement staff, campers have the opportunity to engage in activities involving art, music, and recreation through which they can explore their grief.


Last year many volunteers devoted their time to being camp "Buddies." A Buddy commits to supporting one or two youths during the 48 -hour camp by building a trusting and nurturing relationship with the child and by taking a 6-hour training course to prepare for this task. Buddies help children learn how to cope with their grief and move forward in their healing process. In the past, it was requested that all Buddies spend the night in the cabins.
However, this year there is a new policy that allows Buddies to go home overnight should they choose to do so, leaving at $10 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. and returning by 8 a.m. the next morning.

# RESTAURANT REVIEW Higgy's Farm Market \& Country Café

If you're scouting for a relaxing, unpretentious eatery that serves up simple but well-prepared dishes at a price that won't break your piggy bank, give Higgy's a try. So far, Higgy's is the
 only one (of 24 Farm Markets operating in Queen Anne's County) that offers eat-in breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Owners Bob Hickman and Ben Knight (Ben owns the farm) opened this café in September 2010. You may enjoy the farm market atmosphere, country café, and homemade food while you're in nearby farm country.
Hungry and on my way home from Church Hill Theatre one evening, I made a discovery. Freshly cooked Fried Chicken! Hunger motivates! Deciding to share this feast with neighbors, we sampled the fresh and delicious flavors of the Potato Salad, Macaroni Salad, Shrimp Salad, Cole Slaw, Crab Salad, and Maryland Vegetable Crab Soup. The Fried Chicken was tender, with delicious flavor and coating. Every food we sampled passed the taste test for freshness, flavor, and consistency.

On a return visit to dine in the restaurant, my husband and I sat in a comfortable booth. We enjoyed the Liver and Onions and the Rib Eye Steak. You can see and feel the energy and convergence of both the farm market and restaurant. Fresh produce, real bottled milk, fresh homemade pies, turnovers, and apple dumplings are a few of the temptations. Also try Hutch's (the Chef/Cook) Smoked Ribs, which aren't on the menu but you can ask for them.

Check out the breakfast, lunch, and dinner entrees with dinner specials. Higgy's has started offering a breakfast buffet on weekends. Wait till you sample one of the four char-grilled, halfpound burgers. Also, don't forget to try hot subs, cold subs/sandwiches/wraps, appetizers, and more than 18 different sandwiches from Higgy's Cooler to the Chester River Crab cake. Higgy's makes the best chicken, shrimp, and tuna salads I have had on the Eastern Shore, with more than eight salads to choose from. There are nine different dinner options and each comes with two sides. Top off your dinner with a milkshake that uses ice cream made at Kilby's Farm in Rising Sun, Maryland.
Are you tired of cooking? Do you like nice people who give nice service? Then drive 15 minutes on Route 213 (or SV bikers can ride) to Higgy's Farm Market \& Country Café and say "Hi" to one of the staff, Brittany Van Sant, who can answer questions about the menu. Higgy's is one of those places where you may find it difficult to top the casual atmosphere, well-prepared food, and reasonable prices!

Higgy's Farm Market \& Country Café is open Monday from 6 a.m. to 3 p.m., Tuesday thru Saturday from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m., and Sunday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Breakfast Buffet is offered on weekends from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. for $\$ 10.99$.
