

Remember, "You have to play to win." So bring your lucky charm and come to the next BINGO on **Friday, October 11**.


4th Annual Artisan's Fair





SUGAR BUNS AIRPORT CAFÉ BAKERY & CATERING



Crabzilla Sandwich

For soaring food and scenery, try Sugar Buns, a special place where the food, atmosphere, and service are fresh and inspiring. Dining here for breakfast or lunch while taking in the view of the runway is seriously uplifting! How can you enter this charming French Country atmosphere, sit at one of the dozen gingham-

covered tables, watch lots of aircraft taking off and landing through a sunny window and not feel a little more up?

Inspired by a lack of creative dessert choices in the area, Susan Leonard opened Sugar Buns in 2010. You will find this special place right inside the Easton/Newnam Field Airport, sharing space with a pilot's shop and lounge, as well as airport service and management offices. So, what about the food choices at this airport café? Susan explains that, "Each menu choice is inspired

experimentation with a generous dollop of reverence for the sweet tooth." And speaking of a sweet tooth, beware getting hooked, like I did, on the delicious *Sugar Bun* (small sweet bread with a flat bottom), one of many yummy choices among a wide array of desserts freshly baked throughout the year.

Traveling as a flight attendant, Susan spent decades analyzing recipes and flavors from layovers around the world. Her 17 varieties on the Eggs Benedict Menu reflect her tastes and travels. Some favorites are the Eastern Shore, eggs served on an English muffin with grilled ham, poached eggs, and homemade hollandaise sauce with bacon and a jumbo lump crab artichoke bottom and the Oh La La Parisian Benedict, with warm Brie and Dijon mustard on a croissant. Breakfast is served all day at Sugar Buns. The Elvis French Toast stuffed with bananas, honey, and peanut butter rolled in granola is delicious, as is the famous Crabzilla Sandwich. (See picture.) "Their awesome crabby creation has 6 'legs' of bacon, thick sliced tomato, lettuce, Jumbo Lump Crab Cake, and several homemade onion rings....all on Texas Toast with Olive Eyes, served on an 'isle' of fries." Lunch includes 13 types of hamburgers and 16 or so sandwiches such as the Monster B-L-T and Maine Lobster Roll, to name a few. Don't leave without trying a soup and salad. The Cream of Crab, Lobster Bisque, and Cobb Salad are good choices. For a finale at Sugar Buns, sample the *Jamboree Cupcake*, one choice of at least 12. This particular one tasted delicious, with a very moist pumpkin spice cake, sweet maple cream cheese frosting, and topped with pecan caramel sauce. Okay SV folks, instead of taking an airplane ride with airline food, enjoy a truly *uplifting* meal at Sugar Buns Airport Café!

Bacon Cauliflower Salad

1 medium head cauliflower, broken into florets 1 medium green pepper, chopped 1 cup frozen peas ½ pound bacon, cooked crisp and crumbled 1 cup mayonnaise

1 cup cubed cheddar cheese

2-4 teaspoons sugar

Combine cauliflower, bacon, cheddar cheese, green pepper, and peas. Separately, combine mayonnaise and sugar. Toss with other ingredients. Cover and refrigerate at least 4 hours. Stir before serving.
