# **HOA Email Guidelines**

The approved guidelines for sending out Blast Emails have been edited and are now available on the SV Website.

# **Communication**

Communication was a topic of discussion at the last Board of Directors' meeting. It is important that residents know the different communication devices available.

- 1. The *Libretto* comes out on the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. To conserve costs, residents are encouraged to enjoy the convenience of electronic access to the *Libretto*. However, exceptions can be made to accommodate residents who might have technophobia and/or do not have access to a computer.
- 2. The **Daily Bulletin** (DB) lists new items of interest daily, items that cannot wait until the next *Libretto is* published. The DB is available on the <u>SV Website</u>. It is possible to have the DB on your <u>desktop</u> so it is readily available to view. To set up this icon on your desktop, go to the DB page, shrink the window so you can see the DB page <u>and</u> the desktop at the same time; then, on the menu at the left, click and hold the words "Daily Bulletin" while dragging it to the desktop, then release. The DB icon should be on your desktop. Any time you wish to view the DB (or the Calendar which is on the DB web page) you simply click on the DB icon. If this is as clear as *mud*, please call the *Communication Emergency Hotline* at 410-758-0591.
- 3. **Blast Emails** are sent when the <u>HOA</u>
  <u>Email Guidelines</u> are met. Residents must make sure they have subscribed to receive Blast Emails. To do this, go to the "Directories" page on the <u>SV Website</u> and fill out the <u>Residents List Subscription Form</u>.
- 4. Weekly and Monthly Calendars
  The P & C Committee has adopted the
  Google Calendar to replace the Yahoo
  Calendar because there were too many
  problems with the old one. The Calendar is
  available on the DB web page (see above).
  At the top of that page, click on SV Official
  Calendar. Click on either monthly or
  weekly as you choose. The calendar can be



# Maryland <u>EZPass</u> Toll Plans: Did You Know that the **Shoppers Plan Might Save You Money?**By Margaret Strano

In my recent discussion with friends, I discovered that many users of the *Maryland EZPass* toll plan are unaware of additional toll discount plans offered on the *Maryland EZPass* website. Several plan options are available, depending on bridge-crossing frequency. You will need to look through the plans and decide which plan/plans work best for you.

If you travel from the Eastern Shore to Annapolis more than six times over a period of 90 days, *The William Preston Lane, Jr. Memorial (Bay) Bridge Shoppers Discount Plan* may save you money. The *Shopper's Plan* is designed for occasional users of this specific bridge. The website description of this plan states: "Pay \$3 per trip for 10 trips that can be used **Sunday through Thursday and are valid for 90 days**. The total cost for used and unused trips is \$30."

If you find yourself traveling over the Preston (Bay) Bridge once or twice a week, this plan may indeed be the best option for you. Note that there is no discount on Friday or Saturday. Please be aware that once you make more than 10 trips over a period of 90 days, you may be charged an additional \$30 for an additional 10 trips for another 90-day period. You can activate this plan by going to your current EZPass account on the Maryland EZPass website. Your eligibility for the Shoppers Plan may be contingent on your subscription to other Maryland EZpass toll plans. # Verna's Korner Country Kitchen

Verna's has returned with the same delicious cooking that has earned her a dedicated and loyal following over the years. Now, she has an expanded lunch and dinner

menu to wow shore folks. Verna's was initially reviewed in the October 2010 *Libretto*, which documented her flair for serving comforting breakfasts at the Rams Head Shore House. She also cooked with flair when she owned Verna's Island Inn in Stevensville. Alas, keeping up with Verna is fun!

Newly located in Church Hill, Verna's still cooks three styles of *Eggs Benedict:* the *Traditional* (with Canadian bacon), the *Montoya* (with prime rib), and the *Thomas* (with fresh tomatoes and bacon) – all with her popular hollandaise sauce. The *Our World Famous Seafood Omelette* is really flavorful. The omelette features three eggs with fresh crab, diced sea scallops, and tasty shrimp in a special sauce. The *Silver Dollar Platter* is a good deal because you get pancakes, sausage, bacon, and scrapple, not to mention home fries, toast, and beverage for \$8.69. You may wish to skip a few meals after consuming the *Silver Dollar Platter*. Luckily, Verna still serves her *Creamed Chipped Beef* and her delicious *Sausage*, *Gravy*, *and Biscuits*. But a real gem to try is *Our Famous Blintzes* which consists of two delicate and sweet crepes that are lightly filled with cottage cheese and your choice of strawberry, apple, or blueberry filling.

As for some impressive lunch choices to try at Verna's, come try the Shrimp Sub and the Soft Crab Sandwich. Also try the Deli Sandwiches and Traditional Clubs with your choice of Ham, Roast Beef, Turkey, Chicken, or Tuna Salad. Verna lets you add Gulf Shrimp blended with Chesapeake Bay Seasoning to your sandwich for an additional charge of only \$2. The prices seem very reasonable for the quality of the food prepared here. On a recent Wednesday evening at Verna's, the dinnertime locals filled every seat. Was it the cooking, the atmosphere, or the service? I'll let you decide. All factors do contribute, but to my thinking, it may be Verna's homey style of cooking her favorite shore recipes that folks love. In the new menu are five salad choices. There are also five pasta dishes served with garlic bread and salad. The savory flavors in the Old Fashioned Spaghetti with zesty marinara sauce and Italian meatballs with sweet Italian sausage reminded me of my mother's pasta. Some of the Classic Entrees to enjoy are the Chicken Chesapeake, 8 oz. of Chicken Breast stuffed with Crab Imperial, and the Prime Rib dinner. Both dishes were very tasty with generous portions. If you order from the Seafood Platters section, do try the Whole Fried Clams, Our Award Winning Crabcakes, and the Breaded Local Oysters. For appetizers, try the Hot Buffalo Wings and Our Famous Crab Dip, made with blue crab and spiced cheddar cheese.

Keeping up with Verna seems to be a habit that's hard to break. Just drive North on Route 301 to sample Verna's Korner Country Kitchen. Get spoiled again and be glad she's back!



# Pineapple Bake

From the Kitchen of Marge Strano

½ cup butter 1 cup sugar 4 eggs

8 slices of bread (Schmitz's Italian White Sliced or similar\*)

1 20 oz. can crushed pineapple ½ teaspoon cinnamon ¼ teaspoon nutmeg

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Spray an 8" or 9" baking pan (round or square) with cooking spray.

Cream the butter and sugar together in a large mixing bowl.

Beat the eggs and add to the creamed mixture.

Dice bread into quarter-inch to half-inch cubes and add to mixture.

Add crushed pineapple.

Mix thoroughly and place into prepared baking pan.

Sprinkle top with cinnamon and nutmeg.

Bake for approximately 45 minutes.

Serve warm from the baking pan.

\*Using a different type of bread will change the texture!
