READING FOR FUN BOOK CLUB - Jack Hennessey

The Book Club met on November 19 to discuss the book, *The House Girl*, by Tara Conklin. Pat Loiacano, who also provided snacks and beverage for dessert, recommended this book. The novel is one of overlapping contemporary and historical fictions--in this case, the life of a young New York lawyer, Lina, and a young slave, Josephine with secret talents in 19th century Virginia. The slave, 17-year-old Josephine, cares for her dying mistress Lu Anne, who taught the girl to read and to paint. In 2004, Lu Anne's art is highly praised, but some critics think that the art is really the work of Josephine. Lina is assigned the task of unraveling the mystery. Read this interesting novel to see how the story ends. On a scale of 1 to 10, this book was rated 7.2, making it recommended reading.

Bird Club--Linda Blume



There is at least one Cooper's hawk that has considered my patio with its bird feeders prime hunting territory for the past

few weeks. I see a hawk often, but I have not seen it catch anything. But the hawk's presence probably explains why I see so few birds at the feeders. One

bird I do see throughout the day is the dark-eyed junco (pictured). There are usually three or four pecking under the bird feeders for seeds (I've never seen one perch on any of the feeders) unless the hawk is there as well. Juncos are also known as "snowbirds" since they appear on the East coast as winter sets in and retreat northward each spring.

Juncos are recognized by their dark slate-gray head and upper body parts and by the bright white tail feathers they flash in flight. Juncos are primarily seedeaters, and at bird feeders, they seem to prefer millet to



sunflower seeds. If you have mixed seed in your feeders, you will probably see dark-eyed juncos even when a hungry hawk is in the area.

RESTAURANT REVIEW

Georgie, Owner Scott Cook's son, must be very proud that his father named a new restaurant after him. A newcomer in Centreville, Georgie's Seafood and Grill opened in May 2013, and Scott is determined to serve hearty and meticulously prepared food at reasonable prices. Cook's sincere determination translates to a

restaurant where "eating the absolute best for less" shows in an excellent menu, great cooking, and friendly service.

Blown away on our first visit to Georgie's, my husband Bruce and I ordered the *Baby Back BBQ Ribs*. Not only were the ribs actually "fall off the bone" delicious, juicy, and succulent, but some of the best ribs around. The *Crunchy Fries and Homemade Coleslaw*, in generous portions, are delightfully good. One cannot ignore the lightly sweet, hot, and homemade *Zucchini Bread*. Talk about comforting. Another colorful and light dish that is both flavorful and elegantly presented is the *Fried Tempura Oysters*. Also try the *Authentic Greek Salad* or any of the other salads at Georgie's. They are all delicious!

Expanding one's food repertoire includes trying *the Filet Au Poivre*. The filet medallions in a peppercorn sauce tasted both hearty and robust. Also try the mouthwatering taste of the *Sautéed Scallops* cooked with white wine, garlic, and butter sauce. A proven classic, the *Stuffed Shrimp*,

topped with Imperial Sauce and baked golden brown, did not disappoint. In fact, we continue experiencing different gourmet dishes when we go to Georgie's. The *Salmon Cakes* proved very tasty, as was the *Homemade Mac & Cheese*. The pasta dishes also stand out. Try the *Blackened Shrimp & Crab* over fettuccine with Alfredo sauce, or the *Baked Ziti* dish made with Bolognese meat sauce with mozzarella. All of these dishes are served with one side item and a small house salad.

Light as air and unbeatably decadent, is the *Mississippi Mud Pie*. Just think of an Oreo crusted bottom with coffee ice cream topped with fudge and whipped cream and order an *Apple Caramel Pie a la Mode* to go with it. Okay, maybe one dessert is enough for two. In the world of food and restaurant choices, there is now a Georgie's Seafood and Grill to enchant you. The Cook family feels each "customer is and always is our first priority" and the Cooks" say, "they will provide exceptional service, superior food, and reasonable prices to keep our customers returning again and again." So Villagers, do you dare to give this newcomer a try? Just avoid your kitchen and take the short drive down the road to delight in freshly prepared food in a friendly and casual setting.

Recipe of the Month - December 2013 - Potato Chip Cookies

2 sticks butter, softened

½ cup sugar

13/4 cup flour

³/₄ cup potato chips, coarsely

crushed

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 cup confectioner's sugar, sifted

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Cream the butter and sugar, beating until light and

fluffy.

Add the flour, potato chips, and vanilla and beat

well.

Drop dough by rounded teaspoonfuls onto

ungreased cookie sheets.

Bake for 10 to 12 minutes or until the edges are lightly browned.

Cool 5 minutes on cookie sheets; remove to wire racks.

When cookies are cool, roll each in confectioner's sugar.

Makes about 4 dozen.
